Norms & Procedure



• Establishment of Anti Ragging Committee

Although there has not been a single instance of ragging in the Institute in its history of 60 years, it is declared that ragging is totally banned in Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished. The Hon'ble Supreme Court has issued the following directions to prevent ragging in Technical Institutions—

We recommended that every institution must have an Anti-Ragging Committee and an Anti-Ragging Squad.

It is essential to have a diverse mix of membership in terms of levels as well as gender in both the Anti-Ragging Committee at the level of the Institution should consist of the representatives of civil and police administration, local media, Non-Governmental Organizations involved in youth activities, representatives of faculty members, representatives of parents, representatives of students belonging to the fresher's category as well as seniors, non-teaching staff and should be headed by the Head of the Institutions.

The Anti-Ragging Squad, in contrast, should be a body with vigil, oversight and patrolling functions and should be a smaller body which should be nominated by the Head of the Institute with such representation as considered necessary to keep it mobile, alert and active at all time.

The Squad may be called upon to make surprise raids on hostels and other hot spots and should work under the overall guidance of Anti-Ragging Committee.

The Squad should not have any outside representation and should only consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community.

The Institute strictly complies with these directions and AICTE regulations in this regard.

The following shall be powers and functions of the Ombudsman :-

- (i) He shall exercise its power to hear any grievance -
 - a) of any students against the University or Institute affiliated to it or an Institute, as the case may be, after the student has availed of remedies available in such institute for redressal of grievance and
 - b) of any applicant for admission as student to such institution.
- (ii) No application for revaluation or remarking of answer sheets shall be entertained by the Ombudsman unless specific irregularity materially affected the outcome or specific instance of discrimination is indicated.
- (iii) He shall have power to seek the assistance of any person belonging to the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Socially and economically backward classes (SEBC), minority or disabled category, as amicus curiae, for hearing complaints of alleged discrimination.

The tenure of Prof. Subhanga Sekhar Chatterji will be from 3rd October 2023 to 2nd October 2026.

Prof. Chatterji will be paid by the Institute a consolidated fee of Rs.5,000/- per hearing, in addition to the conveyance.

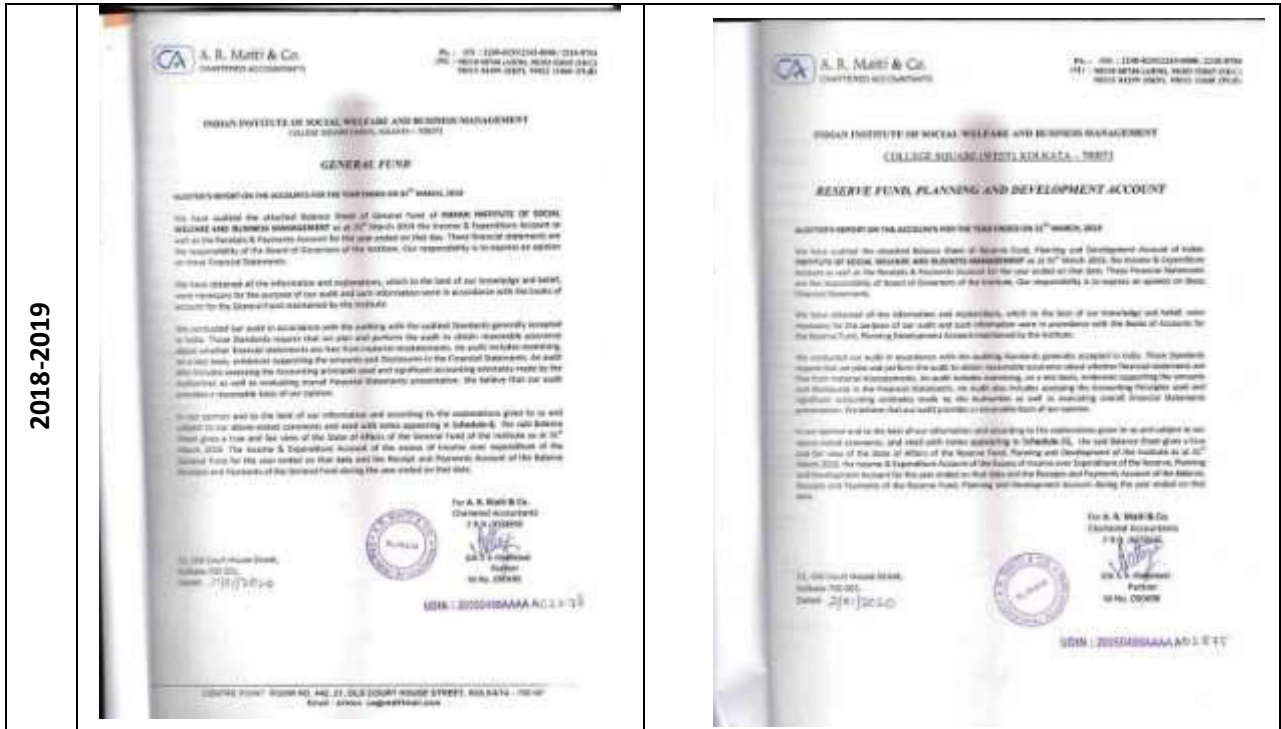
