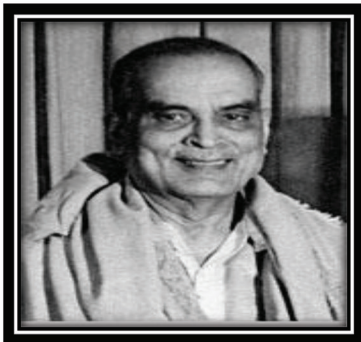

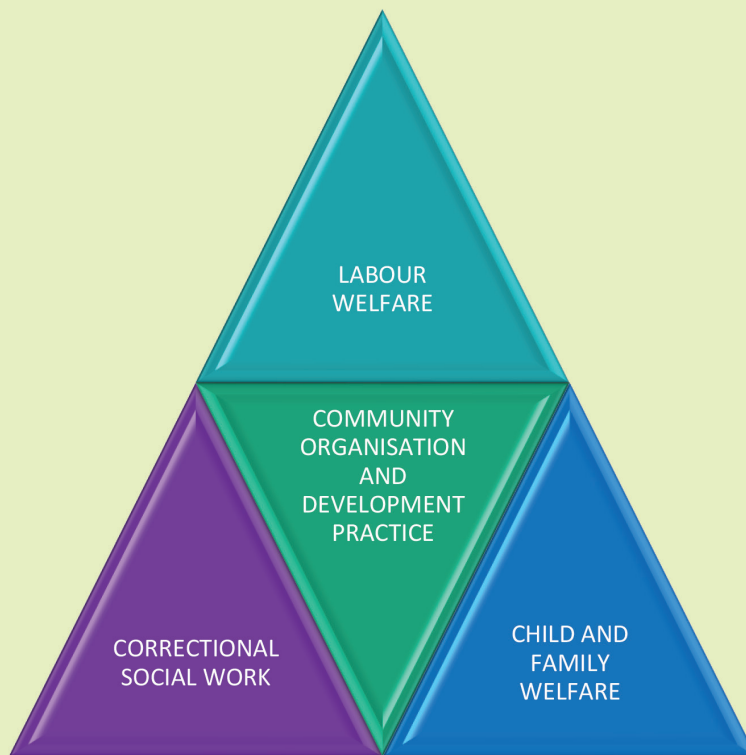

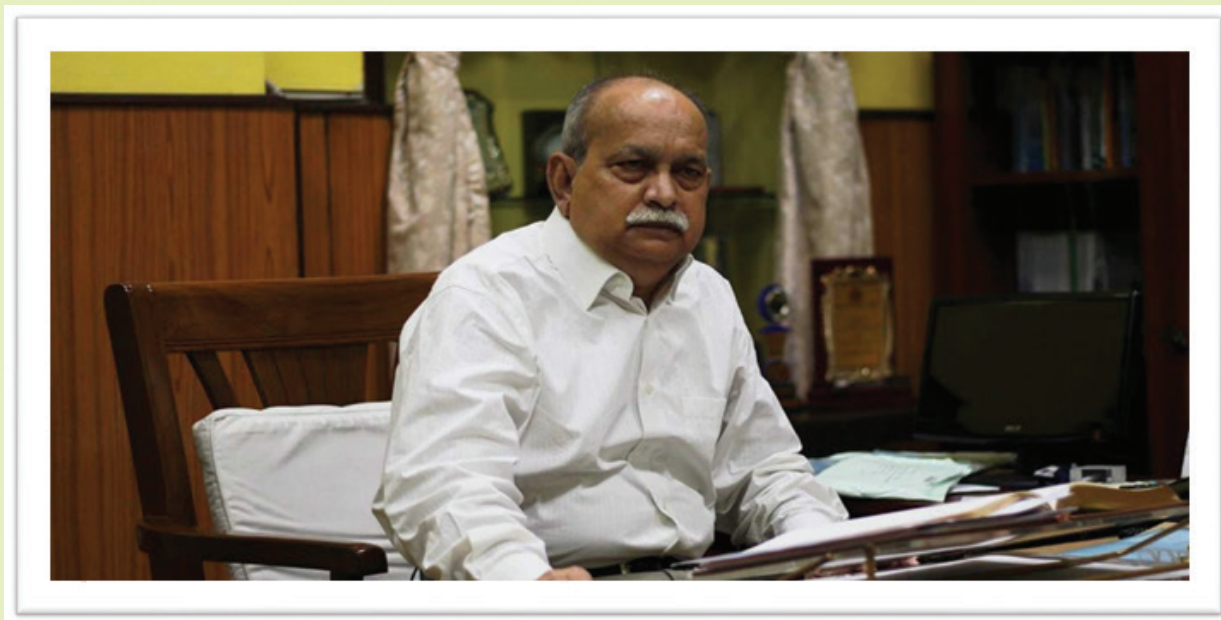

FROM THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT'S DESK

The Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management was set up in the year 1953 with the vision to create professionals to manage professional business organizations with an awareness of the social responsibilities of the business. The name of the Institute itself suggests that the founding fathers felt the need to blend business management with social welfare through academic excellence.

The focus at IISWBM has always been to create socially conscious professional managers. The postgraduate degree program in Social Welfare has been designed to meet the growing need for trained manpower, through value-based professional education for social work in different social spheres. The course provides students with a sound theoretical knowledge about social work, social welfare, laws, politics and the fields and domain of social work. It helps develop knowledge of history and development of social work in India and abroad as well as current trends of social work practices. It aims to develop skills in students for working with people and communities at different levels and network with other groups and professionals working in similar areas. The course also emphasizes an understanding of the relation between the State, its policies and laws and how these can be usefully deployed for ensuring human rights and entitlements.

The course is delivered through classroom sessions, presentations, seminars, field visit as well as field work-based internship. Students are required to choose two specializations to qualify for the degree. The areas offered are Child & Family Welfare, Correctional Social Work, Community Organization & Development Practice Labour Welfare.

In addition to attending regular classes, the students are given the required exposure of social work. This is done by organizing interactions with senior government officials and social workers of various NGOs of national and international repute. They also visit NGOS to have practical exposure of the working of such social welfare organizations.

We try to create through proper, systematic education, trained social work and social welfare professionals who can be employed by various governmental, inter-governmental and non-government organizations working in micro as well as in macro levels, locally, nationally or internationally.

We request you to meet our students and give them an opportunity to work with you.

1953-	IISWBM - India's first Management Institute was constituted on 25 April by a resolution passed by the Senate of the University of Calcutta, with the then Chief Minister Dr. B.C. Roy as the President and Prof. Dr. D.K. Sanyal as founder Director.
1954-	The Institute, for the first time in the country, introduced a PG Diploma in Business Management with affiliation of University of Calcutta. Selection of the Institute as a Centre for course in Business Management was made by AICTE.
1958-	Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru laid the foundation stone of the New Academic Block.
1976-	MBA programme affiliated to the University of Calcutta is introduced.
1997-	Centre for Research in Materials Management (CRIMM), set up in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Materials Management, Mumbai. CRIMM is the first organization of its kind in Asia-Pacific.
2002-	MHRM programme affiliated to the University of Calcutta is introduced.
2003-	The Institute celebrated its Golden jubilee. This year, Government of India released a commemorative stamp on IISWBM to mark 50 years of Management Education in India. National Board of Accreditation (NBA) accredits MBA and PGDBM programmes.
2013-	The Institute celebrated its Diamond jubilee by laying the foundation stone of its second state-of-the-art residential campus at Rajarhat, Kolkata.
2014-	MSW programme affiliated to The University of Calcutta was introduced and M.Phil. course introduced. Recipient of "National Education Leadership Award" for outstanding contribution to Management Education from the ABP Group. Ranked among the Top 6 B-Schools in Eastern Region by the Times B-School Survey.
2015-	PhD programme introduced

India's first B-School, Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management (IISWBM) is a name that weighs abundant in legacy.

From the choicest alumni bandwagon to the grandeur of the building stature at the educational hub of Kolkata, the Institute is stately in ways more than one and was constituted on 25th April, 1953 by a resolution passed by the Senate of the University of Calcutta. This was the culmination of the joint initiative taken by the University of Calcutta, Government of West Bengal, Government of India and the captains of the industry in India to set up for the first time a management education institute in India, a concept alien to many in the educational fraternity at that time.

'The Institute has successfully achieved its Platinum Jubilee, signifying over 60 years of an eventful journey in management education in India.' Dr. B.C. Roy, the then Chief Minister of West Bengal as its Founder-President and Prof. D.K. Sanyal as the Founder Director, thus established IISWBM. Government of India, Department of Posts in recognition of 50 years of glorious existence of the first B-school in the country released a Commemorative Postage Stamp on IISWBM, on 25 April 2004 in New Delhi.

ABOUT MASTERS IN SOCIAL WELFARE (MSW)

The Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management was set up in the year 1953 with the vision to create professionals to manage professional business organizations with an awareness of the social responsibility of business. The idea of Social Welfare has been associated with the institute from the very inception, as the late Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy in his wisdom perceived the connection between Business and Social Welfare. Hence, the evocative name of our institution, The Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management.

In this department, we try to uphold Dr. Roy’s vision. We train our students so that they do not lose sight of the fact that working in the social sector as social workers leads to promoting a healthier socio-economic atmosphere that is conducive to a healthy business sector, while running a socially conscious business initiative creates a synergy between the people and the business world where the people do not eye all the businesses endeavors as purely profit hungry and hence exploitive.

We offer our students specialization in areas of:

1. Community Organization and Development Practice
2. Labor Welfare
3. Child and Family Welfare
4. Correctional Social Work

These specializations provide them an exposure to the different varieties of Social Work, but before the students choose their specializations in their Second Year (or the Third Semester as it is properly called), they are given a sound grounding in sociological theories and other allied analytical methods and perspective so that they can grasp the embeddedness of their own practice of social work in large socio-economic context that connects business practices with Social Welfare.

We send our students for internships in various reputed organizations in the field of social work for them to get some hands-on experience in social work. Therefore, our students do not come out as merely ‘theoreticians’ of social work but as ‘practitioners’ with some experience.

CLASSROOM

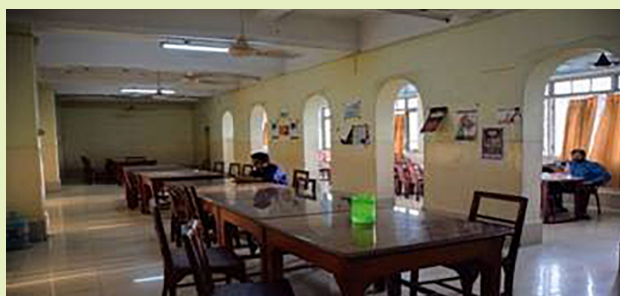


LANGUAGE LABORATORY

PLACEMENT PROCESS & GUIDELINES

- IISWBM follows One Company-One Student Placement Policy.
- Upon receipt of confirmation to participate, we encourage prospective recruiters to deliver Pre-Placement Talk (PPT) on a mutual convenient date or share the details via mail.
- CTC disclosure prior to selection process is a pre- requisite.
- Profiles of interested and eligible candidates are shared with the company.
- During the placement session, there could be a possibility of two or more companies conducting placement drive simultaneously. In such case, whichever company rolls out the job offer first shall get the candidate.
- In order to facilitate the recruitment process, institute will provide the necessary infrastructure.
- Companies participating in the Institute's Placement Process may kindly note that delay in announcing/ confirming the job offers, may result in the selected/ shortlisted candidate being placed in another company.
- If an organization wishes to interview candidates for their Summer Internships, the Placement Cell will facilitate in organizing the same. Period of internship being two months (June-July).
- An organization is free to choose its criteria and method of selection.
- Students on LWP/Sabbatical desirous of participating in campus recruitment, need to furnish 'No Objection' from current employer.
