Day 1: Monday, 29th July, 2024

Faculty In-Charge for the day: Piyali Sengupta



SESSION1:Dr.Pradip Kumar Sikdar

The first session of the day was taken by Prof. (Dr.) Pradip Kumar Sikdar. He is a renowned expert in groundwater hydrology and environmental impact assessment with more than 30 years of experience. He has been the Acting Registrar of IISWBM and is a Fellow of the West Bengal Academy of Science and Technology. Prof. Sikdar has extensively researched and published numerous papers on urban groundwater hydrology, arsenic contamination, and water resource sustainability.

Session overview:

Prof. (Dr.) Sikdar highlighted the issues, challenges and opportunities in Management Education including Public Systems Management. He emphasized on 'developing people through work' and how to become 'a manger to lead by hands'. He claimed that management education is a 'Golden Goose' He also dicussed the National Education Policy 2000 and the importance of MBA-Public Systems in India, stating that a MBA-PS degree combined with some years of work experience will undoubtedly take one to a leadership position in any organization. He also emphasized the need of soft skills, and application of artificial intelligence in management education.

His experience is in advising corporate both domestically and internationally on how to integrate Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) aspects into their core business strategies. He has been instrumental in developing international standards like ISO 14001, 45001, 26000, ISO 37001, and AA 1000 SES. Shri Jain's extensive experience in consulting, training, and policy-making makes him a highly sought-after expert in the field of sustainability.

Session overview:

Shri Jain in his talk discussed the impact of natural resources exploitation on business and sustainability as well as India's policy focus sustainability and inclusivity. He claimed that reskilling and upskilling are necessary to boost the competitiveness of the Indian industry. He also emphasised the Green Transition that is taking on in transport industry.

He is a leading Business Consultant in the fields of Business Restructuring and Business Risk Management. He is on the decision-making level for a variety of societies, and No- Profit Organizations in India and Abroad. He serves on the Board of Directors of many listed Companies as well as the Managing Committee of the Merchants' Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Kolkata and is now the Chairman of the Council for Human Resources and Skill Development. He also serves as the Co-Chairman of Banking and Finance. He serves on many Committees of the Government of West Bengal and the Reserve Bank of India.

He discussed the key areas where Al should be applied, such as reporting, communication, strategy, collaboration, analytics, and so on,. for effective management and smooth functioning of any organization, particularly logistics and consultancy industries.





SESSION 3: Arghya Majumdar

Mr. Arghya Majumdar is an Alumni of IISWBM and currently working for PWC.

Session overview:

Mr. Majumdar discussed the operational parameters that businesses employ to gain a competitive advantage over other organisations with a focus on sustainability. He provided a specific roadmap for business development using a sustainable strategy. He emphasised the need of bridging the gap between the company's developmental goal and attaining sustainable development goals. He also stated that efficient organisational administration is a prerequisite for formulating strategies to achieve the SDGs. He advised the students to stay updated by reading about sustainability.

Dr Debanjan Bandyopadhyay is an Advisor at Environmental Resources Management in Kolkata. Dr Bandyopadhyay is an independent expert specializing in sustainability advisory and digital systems. With over 25 years of experience, he has worked extensively on environmental policy, impact assessments, EHS management and regulatory reviews.









Session overview:

The topic of Dr Bandyopadhyay's session was sustainability. He began the session by discussing the students' goals and motivations for enrolling in the course. He then explained the phrase "Transformational Time". During this session Dr. Bandyopadhyay led the students through a management quiz, in which everyone participated actively. Dr Bandyopadhyay provided an interesting narrative about the East Kolkata Wetlands to better understand the concept of sustainability.

He then engaged in an interactive question-and-answer session with the students clarifying various doubts they had about supply chain management and transportation.

SESSION 1: Mrs. Piyali Sengupta

Session overview:

Ms. Sengupta gave a talk on the larger ramifications of corporate sustainability and how it is linked to basic survival necessities like food, water, shelter, and clothes. She also discussed how human values are inextricably linked to sustainable education, emphasizing the need of cultivating these values in order to promote a sustainable lifestyle. Sustainable living focuses on making small but impactful changes in our daily activities.



Session 2: Mr. Dhrubo Mukherjee

Session overview:

Mr. Mukherjee emphasised the distinction between soft skills and hard human skills. Hard human skills are essential for long-term professional achievement. Artificial Intelligence (AI) may be a powerful tool in the workplace. He discussed how to use AI to enhance productivity, make informed decisions, and improve efficiency. He emphasized the need of asking for assistance when necessary. Empathy is more important, than sympathy when it comes to creating a friendly and collaborative work environment. Understanding oneself is the first step towards professional development.

SESSION 3: Ms. Sona Banerjee

Session overview:

She discussed the importance of human values in professional development, particularly in the context of MBA education. Values reflect what is important to us and influence our interactions with the world. Adhering to our values ensures consistency and integrity in our actions and decisions. She highlighted numerous universal values that are essential for personal and professional growth.





SESSION 4: Mr. Joy Chakraborty

Mr. Joy Chakraborty graduated from IISWBM's HHM (Hospital and Healthcare Management) program in 1996.

Session overview:

Mr. Chakraborty shared his journey, insights, and vital leadership and customer service tips. He explained his early desire of being a doctor, demonstrating the diverse pathways one might pursue in their career. He emphasized the importance of attempting to be a good leader, stating, "Try to be a good leader, and then you can be a fantastic manager." He recommended students to focus on case studies and embrace challenges rather than becoming highly specialized in subjects like healthcare or human resources. He highlighted that people rarely remember when everything goes perfectly, but they do recall when something goes wrong. This underscores the importance of addressing service failures effectively. He proposed this equation: Excellent service = Customer perception - Customer expectation. This formula emphasizes the need to exceed customer expectations to achieve excellence.





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
