The first day provided an excellent opportunity for the students to interact with eminent personalities from industry and NGO sectors.




# MSW Induction Programme,

Theme: Panel Discussion

The 5th day of the induction programme had 2 insightful panel discussions, with eminent speakers.

The panellists of the first discussion were- Dr. Prof. Sudeshna Basu Mukherjee( Moderator ), Dr. Prof. Debaprasad Chatterjee, Dr. Udita Mitra, Prof. Samarprita Ghosh Ray and Dr. Prof. Nabaruna Majumdar.

The Topic was – Social Work and Sociology are interconnected in the field of academia.

The panel highlighted:

i)Empathy is a key concept for both the fields

ii)Focus should be on studying the motive of the individual

iii)Focus should be on individual rather than groups, as individuals are capable of meaningful social actions.

iv)Both Social Work and Sociology inculcate basic social value so that the implementation on the society which is done by the social work for the betterment of the society can be prepared well.

The Moderator concluded by saying that each and every individual should enjoy the learning process and not take it as a burden. As enjoying the learning materials and procedure is the only key to success.

The Second discussion had panelists Dr. Prof. Sudeshna Basu Mukherjee (Moderator), Prof. Saheli Guha Neogi, Prof. Annanya Chatterjee, Prof. Jyoti Prasad, Ms. Anuja Gupta, Prof. Pinaki Roy.

The Topic was – Sociology & Social Work: Complementarities

The Highlights of the discussion were-

- i)Both sociology and social work aim to analyze the nature of human social relationships. However, sociology alone cannot conceive, formulate, and apply the principles of human nature by itself. This is where social workers come in, bridging the gap between theory and practice.
- ii) Considerations should be made on the potential challenges that social workers and sociologists may face while collaborating, especially when addressing complex social issues.
- iii) Different perspectives in sociology, such as Feminism, post-modernism, and Functionalism, has had impact on the social work
- iv)The idea of Disaster Capitalism and how it has originated from the theories of liberalism and neo liberalism
- v)Key areas for future consideration include migration, education, and sustainable management.

The Moderator summarised the discussion by highlighting that social work's complexity stems from its intersection with diverse sociological theories, necessitating a sophisticated grasp of how society functions.

After an interactive question and answers session, the discussions ended on a fruitful note. The students were enlightened on various topics, and got motivated to pursue the Social Work discipline with new found interest.

The 5th day concluded the week long induction session, and the vibrant students were ready to officially begin their course work.
