Following him, Mr. Sumedh Kumar Patodia offered a fresh perspective from the world of professional volleyball. He stressed that strong management and clear leadership are just as important as player performance. Urging the students to learn not only from textbooks but also from real-world experiences, he encouraged them to take every opportunity to be hands-on and innovative.
